

Energy Disputes: the Past and the Future

The increasing global demand for energy, the transition from fossil fuels to cleaner alternatives, access to resources, geopolitical considerations, territorial claims and energy security has led to a remarkable escalation of energy disputes, commanding the attention of arbitration practitioners and introduced new dimensions to international arbitration. SCC Arbitration Institute, Energy Disputes Arbitration Center (EDAC), RPC (London) and Boden Law (Turkiye) invite you to explore the international landmark cases, setting trends and addressing unforeseen challenges in international dispute resolution at a half-day conference preceding the ISTAW opening ceremony.

The conference is a part of the SCC Arbitration Institute's energy arbitration debate, aiming to provide a platform for global arbitration practitioners to engage in constructive dialogues, particularly centering around the resolution of East-West disputes. The inaugural panel, moderated by renowned Jonathan Wood FCIArb, Chair of RPC's International Arbitration Practice in London, President elect 2024 at the CIARb and Chair of the Board of LCAM, will feature distinguished panelists Barton Legum, Founding Partner Honlet Legum Arbitration, member of the SCC Board, Değer Boden (Founding Partner at Boden Law), Tatiana Minaeva (Partner and Head of Investor-State Disputes at RPC) and Crina Baltag (Stockholm University). Together they will present and analyze the landmark energy cases that have changed the landscape of international arbitration.

In the subsequent session, expertly guided by Tatiana Minaeva, the discussion will shift its focus to the contemporary procedural challenges encountered by practitioners in energy disputes. Esteemed speakers including Berceste Elif Duranay (Secretary General, EDAC), Jonathan Wood, Natalia Petrik (SCC Deputy Secretary General), and Aybars Yağız (Deputy Managing Director of Legal and Corporate Communications, Gama Energy) will examine the evolving procedural trend in energy arbitrations.
